

Drug seizures in Europe reflect an exponential increase in illegal trafficking by sea. Cocaine flows are discreetly integrated into regular routes between South America, West Africa and Europe. Potentially contaminated vessels are complex to identify due to the large amount of data required. Data exchange remains slow, or even non-existent. Increased cooperation is now necessary. Each European agency holds part of the information allowing these "vessels of interest" (VOI) to be located. CISE fills the current gaps by providing a network for exchanging VOIs and associated documents. It offers greater operational responsiveness by facilitating the sharing of useful information conducive to decision-making.




DAVA triggers a CISE ALERT for a VOI suspected of transporting drugs to a European country. Participants feed the alert by transmitting information confirming the suspicion. The scenario makes it possible to verify the ability of each participant to monitor the navigation. Thanks to all these contributions, the DNGCD is able to prepare the reception and inspection visit of the ship upon its arrival in France.

- Transit FM Varna (BU) to Fortaleza (BE) in 15 days

TRIAL SCENARIO DESCRIPTION

Day 1 Alert triggered by DAVA to 🚳 🕏 🖑 : position near Algeciras, course, speed, IMO, MMSI, name, call sign.

Day 1 FM Bulgaria: crew list INTEL: Captain recorded for drug trafficking

Day 2: Monitoring by DAVA & DNGCD Next POC unknown. Speed slows down

Day 2: FM Slovenia: concealment of Capt.'s nationality: BE Plan of the ship

Day 2: FM Greece: Last positions recorded (historic)

Change of ship's flag one week ago IMO change. Former name: « Ciçek Açabilir »

Day 3: Spanish air patrol up to the limit of Spain/French TTW. Updated photo of the ship.

Day 4: French air patrol above the FR TTW.

Day 4: FM Slovenia: INTEL: next POC is Marseille Fos/mer

Day 5: escort of the vessel by a FR OPV until her Arrival at Marseille Fos/mer.

CISE-ALERT

Visit of the ship: 500 k of cocaine hidden in the sea chest.

CISE facilitates information sharing through the creation of a common language. This standardization ensures that all stakeholders can leverage high-value elements within a robust data model via a secure end-to-end
